What are the advantages of this type of activity when learning a language?


- 1) It increases the student's interest in learning English, so he or she can discover that the language is also useful outside the classroom.



Shakespeare Exercises





HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Shakespeare's career as an actor and playwright began when he moved to London from Stratford-upon-Avon in around 1590. While his family stayed in Stratford, William Shakespeare became a wealthy and popular writer and part owner of London' Globe Theatre.

Permanent plays were new at the time, and Shakespeare's plays were among the first to be performed in them. Acting companies were made up entirely of male actors, with boys playing female roles. Shakespeare's plays were popular with ordinary people who came to see his plays at The Globe and The Blackfriars Indoor Theatre. They were also performed to England's aristocracy, and Shakespeare was a favourite of both Queen Elizabeth I and King James I.

Macbeth was written in about 1606, three years after King James I succeeded Elizabeth I as sovereign of England. James was already the king of Scotland when he inherited the throne, so he is officially titled James VI and I. To win the king's favour, Shakespeare wrote a play about James's Scottish ancestors Macbeth, King Duncan, Malcom, Donalbain and Banquo were real people who lived in Scotland in the eleventh-century.

Although it is true that the real Macbeth killed King Duncan, Shakespeare's play is not historically accurate. Banquo, James's ancestor is shown to be an honourable man, but in reality he may have actually helped Macbeth to kill Duncan.


A brave Scottish general named Macbeth receives a prophecy from a trio of witches that one day he will become King of Scotland. Consumed by ambition and spurred to action by his wife, Macbeth murders King Duncan and takes the Scottish throne for himself. He is then wracked with guilt and paranoia.



Research!

1. Where does the play take place?

Scotland, most northerly of the four parts of the United Kingdom, occupying about one-third of the island of Great Britain. The name Scotland derives from the Latin Scotia, land of the Scots, a Celtic people from Ireland who settled on the west coast of Great Britain about the 5th century.

The Plot


